## What Is Tenugui?

Tenugui has been a very familiar and useful tool for the Japanese people since the Edo period (1600-1800). It is a thin Japanese towel made from 100% cotton. The uses for tenugui over the years have been as handkerchiefs, hand towels, bandages and even headwear. Over the last 100 years or more, the tenugui has been given as business cards, greeting cards and a small gift for store openings. The printing process is done much the same way it was done for hundreds of years.

Traditionally, the size of the tenugui is 35cm x 90cm. The motifs are mostly of Japanese imagines but today the tenugui has taken on a more contemporary feeling. Recently, people have used them as presents, tapestries and other ways of decorating their homes. With the increased design motifs and the contemporary artistic expression, tenugui has now become more than a hand towel but has become a true piece of Japanese art. In Tokyo and around all of Japan there are stores and even art galleries that sell only tenugui, many in limited editions.

The tenugui that you see today are part of a 3,000 piece collection from the Woodman/Shimko Design Gallery which has been collecting these pieces since 1996.
